

Payment Process for LURA and USRA

York students: Direct Deposit to Bank Account

- Posted on the 15th of each month (maybe later in May)
 - Expect funds to appear within 5 business days
- To receive payments, student need to ensure their banking information is up to date (ASAP)

Health & Safety Training Requirement



Job Specific H&S Training (ex. biosafety, compressed gas, equipment specific training, etc.)	Job dependent



Student Expectations – Health & Safety

Know the hazards present in your work area and complete all necessary training PRIOR to starting work

- > Physical
- > Chemical
- > Biological
- > Ergonomics
- > Psychosocial
- > Etc.
- Follow all the rules, procedures, and protocols that have been instructed to you



Student Expectations – Health & Safety

Familiarize yourself with emergency contacts and emergency response procedures

- Locations of safety equipment (ex. eyewash/shower station, fire extinguisher, telephone, SDS)
- > Egress routes, injury, equipment failure, etc.
- Contact York Security Services at (416) 650-8000, or from your office phone at extension 58000 if you require assistance with access/emergencies.
- If you lost access or require access to a certain space, fill out the <u>online access request form</u>.

Report any incidents or safety concerns as soon as possible.

STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

Work with your supervisor


- Complete your assigned duties as per the direction of your supervisor.
 - Best Practice: Keep detailed notes about your work in a dedicated notebook
 - Discuss with your supervisor on how you will document your work.
- Keep your supervisor informed of your availability to work the agreed-upon full-time hours.
 - If you are unable to honour your commitment, wish to withdraw, or take time off, speak to your supervisor immediately and try to arrange a more workable schedule.
- Students are only allowed to take two 3-credit courses during the summer. This must be approved in advance by the 14supervisor.

SUPERVISOR EXPECTATIONS

Professors are expected to

- Provide a safe and nurturing environment including proper safety training.
- > Communicate expectations to the student.
- > Meet with the student regularly to discuss the assigned work and progress.
- Support the student during the Undergraduate Summer Research Conference (e.g. supervise the presentation preparations, attending the event).



Meet Ivan Mishev, a 3rd-year Earth and Atmospheric Science student at York University. Having specialized in Geomatic Science, Ivan is spending the summer exploring Global Navigation Satellite Systems (GNSS) in Dr. Sunil Bisnath's GNSS Laboratory.

Specifically, Ivan will be working with a GNSS signal simulator to develop output files that can be used with Precise Point Positioning (PPP) GNSS measurement processing algorithms. This mechanization will enable the GNSS Lab to assess PPP algorithms more thoroughly and allow for more accurate error modelling.

The aim of this research is to improve accuracy from 10s of metres to the











The Undergraduate Summer Research Conference
